Seminar Two overview

The second of four seminars will dive deeper into the key issues raised in Seminar One, specifically on the development of health systems and the challenge of responding to both short-term 'shocks' and longer-term trends. System shocks can cause radical and sudden mismatches between the demand for health and care and the workforce required to deliver it. Covid-19 and its impact on rapidly increasing demand in the last couple of years and its likely knock-on effects will be a key feature of this seminar.

Lord Nigel Crisp is an independent crossbench member of the House of Lords in the UK. He was Chief Executive of the English NHS and Permanent Secretary of the UK Department of Health from 2000-2006. He now works and writes mainly on global health. He founded the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Global Health and the global programme 'Nursing Now', both of which he co-chaired.

Dr Yaseen Arabi – Chairman, Intensive Care Department; Medical Director, Respiratory Services and Professor, King Saud bin Abdulaziz University for Health Sciences, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia



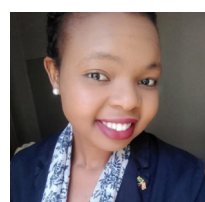
Dr Arabi is currently the principal investigator on several multicenter randomized controlled trials, including research on MERS and Covid-19. He has over 450 publications including articles in leading medical journals, alongside multiple grants and awards for his work.
